Lee Morris...Western Region Director

This last outing was at Stumphouse Park in the upstate. I could not make it but Lee Morris our regional guide did a short write up on that trip.

The day was sunny and a bit hazy, but more importantly, not as hot or humid than the majority of the state! We met in the large parking lot (it turns out it was the middle parking lot) and our first main sighting was two active bald-faced hornet nests that a couple of us had parked under. After introductions, we did our scatter thing. The Issaqueena Falls trail is short, so a few people headed there for a glimpse of the falls while they were in the sun. Others headed up to the Stumphouse Tunnel for a short jaunt through the cool cave-like interior. A few of us briefing started on the Blue Ridge Railway Trail, but after noticing a steep climb, we decided our calves would thank us if we tried the Stumphouse Palmetto Trail instead.

The day was punctuated with insects (like a good summer hike should be), but not many of the biting kind. The Palmetto Trail was shaded up to the Walhalla Reservoir. There were many different plants and fungi all around, although surprisingly few birds.

This next trip on August 27th will be to Mount Pisgah in North Carolina.

Mount Pisgah, NC Blue Ridge Parkway Mile post 407 August 27, 2022, 10:30AM

We will meet at the first Mount Pisgah parking lot to enjoy the views at Buck Springs and for our greetings with photo shoot. There are a few trails to explore from here.

We welcome the Carolina Butterfly Society to join us.







Mount Pisgah Trail

Trail begins at the far end of the Mount Pisgah Parking Area. It is 1.8 miles to the summit. The first 0.5 miles is fairly flat. The remaining 1.2 miles is moderate to strenuous. Lots of rock steps, for an ascent of 712 feet.

The trail passes through a forest of Northern Red Oaks, maples, birches and pockets of rhododendrons and mountain laurel to a deciduous heath bald at the summit at 5721 feet. An observation deck for a 360-degree view and the transmission tower sits at the summit.

To the NE views of Craggy mountains, Asheville, and the French Broad River Valley, to the West Shining Rock Wilderness and Cold Mountain and to the SW Looking Glass.

Most of the wildflowers can be seen for the first 0.5 miles. White snake root, Jerusalem artichoke, bee balm, Angelica, self-heal (*Prunella vulgaris*), purple flowering raspberry (*Rubus odoratus*), Joe-pye weed (a butterfly magnet), and lots of ferns and mushrooms. Listen for the dark eyed juncos and warblers along the trail. Peregrine falcons are commonly spotted at the summit. Many wildflowers are native and some endangered.

Buck Spring Trail

This 1.1-mile-long portion of the Mountains-to-Sea Trail runs between the Mount Pisgah Inn and the Buck Spring Gap Parking Area. The trail passes the site where the mountain cabin of George Vanderbilt and Buck Spring Lodge once stood.

Shut In Trail

Shut In Trail is 16.3 miles long and descends over 3,000 feet. Walk the trail in as far as you like and backtrack out to return.







Directions

From Asheville there are numerous paths to get to the Blue Ridge Parkway. From Bent Creek River Park/NC Arboretum on NC191, hop onto the BRP and head south, approximately 10 miles, to Milepost 407. Turn left into Mount Pisgah Parking area. Park at the first parking area Buck Springs Gap. Along the BRP there are several tunnels. Check that your headlights are off when you park.

There are 2 parking lots at Mount Pisgah. The first is Buck Springs Gap Overlook where we will meet. If you continue N 0.2 miles, you will reach the 2nd parking lot. You can easily walk in between the two lost via road or take a trail. The Mount Pisgah trailhead is located at the far end of the second parking lot.


Lodging and Food

Pisgah campground is a little less than a mile and a half away. There is a trail from the campground to Mount Pisgah trail head.

Pisgah Inn is only a mile away at Milepost 408 which has rooms available with great views. They have a nice observation deck, restrooms, and a good restaurant. Restaurant fills quickly so make a reservation if you would like to eat dinner. Dinner is served from 5:00 to 9:00 PM.
