#### Hello SCAN members!

In December we had an earlier than normal get together. Mostly we meet on the fourth Saturday of each month, but with Christmas coming up we met on the second Saturday instead. This time it was to Carolina Sandhills National Wildlife Refuge. Todd Johnston was our Regional Director who got things set up for us and he had a good grasp of the place. I had been to the Refuge some before but do not know it very well at all. It encompasses a huge area...of about 45,000 acres between McBee and Cheraw in the northeast portion of the state. Quite incredible and underutilized, I think.

Our group met at the Carolina Sandhills Refuge Headquarters and Visitor Center. We had an interesting crowd of Naturalists...more than I would have expected for this time of year. We had Greg Ross, Tom Bott (a visitor not with us but interested), Ronnie and Marty Hucks, Alison Smith, David Schuetrum, Johannes and Claudia Stratmann, Lee Morris, Caroline Eastman, Jerry Bright, Todd Johnston, Edward Ingram, Paul Kalbach, Kim McManus, Tom Austin, and Nancy Jordan (Biologist at Sandhills).



Todd Johnston got us set up with the biologist on the place...Nancy Jordan. She is the expert on the endangered Red-cockaded Woodpecker. Sandhills has probably the largest population of them in the state. Nancy showed us the extendable camera viewer for looking into the nest trees and talked at some length about the species.



Nancy the Biologist took us out to see inside a Red-cockaded Woodpecker nest. We caravanned into the refuge following the expert.



Nancy told us all sorts of things about the birds and other neat things on the refuge. We bogged her down with questions...which I think she enjoyed.



The nest trees are marked with a band of white paint. Whenever you see a large pine in the middle of the woods with a white stripe around it...that means that it is a Red-cockaded Woodpecker nest tree. These birds make their nest cavity in the living tree and the sap that runs down the tree protects the birds from predators. I did not get the chance to ask how the biologists train the birds to paint the stripes on the trees to help people find the trees in the first place, though.



We had a bit of lunch at one of the viewing sites. There's Jerry Bright, Todd Johnston, and Edward Ingram. Scott Wietecha was crawling around down below in the weeds looking for snakes.

- Charlie's career was as a librarian when he began studying Michaux. Study deepened, leading to
  writing and speaking about the botanist--initially in gardens and living rooms, but eventually even at the
  Smithsonian in Washington.
- Tim Evans is Audubon South Carolina's Forest Program Manager and Director of Land Conservation. All the places Audubon owns are managed under his supervision for wildlife and forest management.
- Dr. Charles Horn is the Botanist at Newberry College and is the expert on wild azaleas and rhododendrons. He goes all over the country hunting those species.
